Dear Dr. Pogue:

Another hurriedly written note. I imagine you have been busy during the past few days. I hope you had completed most of the information which you needed from General Marshall before his death. He really was a remarkable figure!

Can you give me an estimate of your expenses for the trip to Lexington? I have been trying since April 29 to get a statement of the finances of our Section. For five weeks I have worked at it desperately. On September 16 I wrote our secretary-treasurer requesting the Minutes and treasurer's reports. Since then I have made two long-distance calls to her insisting that she send them immediately as I needed them to make my reports prior to the convention. Each time I have called she has promised to put them in the next mail. Finally, Monday I received the Minutes for the past sixteen years but no record of her Minutes for the past two years and no indication of the amount in our treasury. Again, a note which she had attached stated that her records would be in the next mail -- but they just don't come. I shall call her the third time tonight. I really shudder to think of the condition which she probably has the records in. I know, however, that we have some money, and I think we can work things out satisfactorily. I am so pleased that you have been able to include our meeting in your busy schedule, and I want the gratuity to be as much as possible.

The convention issue of the KIA Bulletin, which should have been out two weeks ago, is still not ready for distribution. The Ledger promised to have them ready for Dr. Woodbridge two weeks ago, but as he hasn't put any pressure on, Mr. Williams continues to postpone delivery another day. The latest report is that they will be delivered in the morning. I'll put one "in the next mail" after we get them. It carries information concerning our meeting and speaker. If I have failed to give you any information which you need, please let me know.

We'll be so glad to have Christine as a guest at the breakfast. I'll be registered at the Phoenix and will be delighted to see you two when you arrive.
