

CALLOWAY COUNTY
FISCAL COURT MEETING
June 19, 2026, Special Meeting

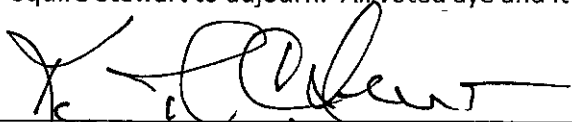
An adjourned special called meeting of the Calloway County Fiscal Court was held at 10:00 AM on Friday June 19, 2026, in the Calloway County Court House Annex. Judge Executive Kenneth C. Imes called the meeting to order, led the Pledge of Allegiance, and a prayer. The following duly qualified members of the Court were present: Squire Don Cherry, Squire Paul Rister, Squire Larry Crutcher and Squire Ricky Stewart. Also, present were County Treasurer Tonya Robinson, Deputy Judge Executive Gina Winchester and County Clerk Antonia Faulkner.

Judge Imes presented to the Court a request for approval to go forward with improvements to the Courthouse clock. The restoration of the current bell, the addition of a sound system, and the clock face replacement, and with this request it was mentioned that private donations may be available to lessen the cost of the County. Squire Rister and Deputy Judge Exec Winchester discussed the noise issue of the music that may be played with the City of Murray. After further discussion, motion made by Squire Cherry was seconded by Squire Crutcher to approve the proposal as presented. All voted aye and it was so ordered.

The Court discussed the Grubbs Bridge replacement. The 24-foot prefab bridge with removal and installation would be placed by Harper Construction. Discussion of guard rails, and back fill concluded that the rails could be used from the previous bridge and back fill would be handled by the County. Motion made by Judge Imes seconded by Squire Crutcher to approve proceeding with the project. All voted aye and it was so ordered.

Judge Imes presented in the form of a motion to allow approval of permission of the neighboring property owner of the County's Hwy 641/80 property to cut down a hill as he cuts down his portion of the hill. This would be of no cost to the County and would make the property worth more. The Court discussed the depth of the cut, the liability of the County, and that the neighboring landowner's part in the action. Judge Imes discussed the County Attorney preparing a waiver of the County's liability, ect. Judge Imes motion was seconded by Squire Crutcher to move forward with the project. All voted aye and it was so ordered.

There being no further business on the special meeting agenda, motion made by Squire Rister seconded by Squire Stewart to adjourn. All voted aye and it was so ordered.
