

CALLOWAY COUNTY  
FISCAL COURT MEETING  
July 15, 2026, Regular Meeting

An adjourned regular meeting of the Calloway County Fiscal Court was held at 9:00 a.m. on Wednesday July 15, 2026, in the Calloway County Courthouse Annex. Judge Executive Kenneth C. Imes called the meeting to order, led the Pledge of Allegiance, and led a prayer. The following duly qualified members of the Court were present: Squire Don Cherry, Squire Paul Rister, Squire Larry Crutcher, and Squire Ricky Stewart. Also, present were County Treasurer Tonya Robinson, Deputy Judge Gina Winchester, County Clerk Antonia Faulkner, and County Attorney Bryan Ernstberger.

Judge Imes began by recognizing and thanking the members of Destination Calloway and The Calloway County Geological and Historical Society for their recent donation to the Courthouse Clock Renovation Project.

Judge Imes requested the approval of the minutes from the regular June 24 meeting. Motion made by Squire Rister seconded by Squire Crutcher to waive the formal reading and approve the minutes as presented. All voted aye and it was so ordered.

County Treasurer Tonya Robinson presented the treasurer's report starting with a request to approve the financial statement. After a discussion motion made by Squire Stewart seconded by Squire Rister to approve the statement as presented. All voted aye and it was so ordered. Motion made by Squire Crutcher was seconded by Squire Rister to pay the bills. All voted aye and it was so ordered. The Court then reviewed the transfers, motion made by Squire Rister seconded by Squire Stewart to approve the transfer in the amount of \$300,000.00 from the money market account to general for the jail as presented. All voted aye and it was so ordered. Motion made by Squire Crutcher seconded by Squire Rister to approve the transfer of \$250,000.00 from the general account to the road account. All voted aye and it was so ordered.

Treasurer Robinson then presented to the Court for approval the 25-26 Final Settlement. After a discussion motion made by Squire Rister seconded by Squire Stewart to approve the settlement as presented. All voted aye and it was so ordered.

During Resolutions the Court reviewed a memorandum of agreement between the County and KYTC. Resolution 26-0715-A regarding the resurfacing of Bailey Cemetery Road, Winchester Road, Hollytree Road, and Potts Road were discussed. Motion made by Squire Crutcher seconded by Squire Rister to approve as presented. All voted aye and it was so ordered. Resolution 26-0715-B regarding the repair or replacement of Wrather Road Bridge, not to exceed \$480,000.00, was discussed. Motion made by Squire Rister was seconded by Squire Stewart to approve the resolution as presented. All voted aye and it was so ordered.

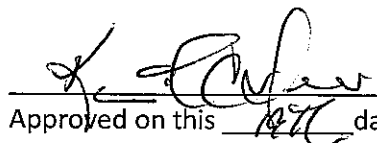
There were no board appointments nor personnel appointments for this meeting, however, the Court reviewed an updated contract to be signed for the electrical inspector. Motion made by Squire Stewart seconded by Squire Rister to approve the contract by giving Judge Imes permission to sign the contract as presented. All voted aye and it was so ordered. In the form of a motion, Judge Imes, at the request

of the Road Department Supervisor Chris Franklin, requested the addition of Pavement Restoration, Inc (PRI) to the road dept. bid list for the purchase of cold mix pickup and delivery. After a discussion, motion was seconded by Squire Stewart to approve the request. All voted aye and it was so ordered.

During committee reports, Deputy Judge Exec. Gina Winchester gave an update on the Admin/Ordinance Committee, and HR Director Tori Saul gave an update on the Safety Committee. Judge Imes discussed the last parcel paperwork of the Fort Heiman project, stating this should complete the project. Squire Paul Rister discussed a Data Center Ordinance. This is a Moratorium allowing addition time for the Court to study, research, determine actions from the City and State legislation to determine the best fit for Calloway County. This ordinance was presented for the first reading. Squire Rister then took the time to thank the Road Dept. Squire Cherry thanked those for the work with July 4<sup>th</sup> festivities. Squire Crutcher thanked those that helped with the storm cleanup including a reminder to be patient the work will be completed. Squire Stewart echoed all those thoughts. Road Supervisor Franklin expressed appreciation for the new trucks stating the department is keeping things moving. Judge Imes discussed the Tire Amnesty Oct 22-24 at the Fair Grounds.

A discussion regarding chicken barns was brought before the Court by a resident of Green Plain Road.

There being no further business before the Court, motion made by Squire Crutcher seconded by Squire Stewart to adjourn. All voted aye and it was so ordered.
